Fire	Children and Adults	No smoking in building will be enforced by helpers. Fire extinguishers are located throughout the building. Leader has access to mobile phone at all times Children will not be allowed in the kitchen	Hand sanitiser freely available in kitchen, church entrances and hall. Tissues available in kitchen
Scalding by hot drinks	Children and Adults	Children will not be allowed in the kitchen. All adults and children should be sat down when handling hot drinks.	
Injury on Soft Play Equipment	Children	A notice informing carers that the area must be supervised by them in place. This notice also explains where the First Aid Kit is located and to who damages should be reported. Radiator covers have been made and installed. First Aid Kit is located in the kitchen along with folder for reporting incidents.	
Injury from electrical sockets	Children	Socket covers are in place around the room	
Food Poisoning	Children and Adults	Food Hygiene booklet is located in the Kitchen. Utensils are always used when serving food and aprons are also worn by all Cafe helpers. Dishwasher now used for all items instead of washing up by hand to ensure fully sterilised and clean.	

Hand Washing	Adult Kitchen Volunteers	Volunteers to wash hands before handling cutlery and food equipment for 20 seconds with soap and water and proper drying. Volunteers to be reminded to catch coughs and sneezes in tissues and to avoid touching face, eyes, nose or mouth with unclean hands.	
Food Handling	Kitchen volunteers	Disposable gloves to be worn	
Soft Play equipment	Children and Adults	Soft play to be sanitiser sprayed after use.	Sanitiser spray placed by soft play area out of reach of children
Creche toys	Children and adults	Creche toys to be wiped or sanitiser sprayed after use	Sanitiser spray and anti bacterial wipes to placed near creche toys ouyt of reach of children
Room Ventilation	Children and Adults	Non Fire Doors including outer main door to be left open and some windows to provide adequate ventilation to prevent spread of Covid-19	
Café Social Distancing	Adults	Small tables seating up to 4 to be available and a 2 metre distance rule applied
